## HERE'S THE STORY...

- ♦ The D-backs have won 7 consecutive regular-season games vs. Dodgers, 1 shy of the team record vs. Dodgers (2x; last: July 6-Aug. 3, 2012).
- ♦ A win today would give the D-backs their fourth consecutive series win vs. Dodgers for the first time since Sept. 11, 2012-June 12, 2013.
- ♦ A win would give Arizona a victory in each of the first 2 series of the season for the second consecutive year for the first time since 2012-13.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt's** 28 home runs and 90 RBI are the most by an active player vs. Dodgers.
- ♦ **A.J. Pollock** has reached base safely in 29 consecutive games vs. Dodgers @ Chase Field since July 10, 2013, the longest such streak vs. Los Angeles in franchise history.

## YESTERDAY/THIS MORNING'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs prevailed 8-7 vs. Dodgers, in the longest game in Chase Field history (5:45).
- ♦ **Jeff Mathis** hit the walk-off single in the 15th inning, his fifth career game-ending plate appearance...**Chris Owings** hit a 3-run, game-tying home run in the ninth off of Kenley Jansen...**Ketel Marte** was 3-for-7 with a RBI and became just the ninth D-back to hit 2 triples in the same regular-season game.
- ♦ RHP **Fernando Salas** earned the win and tied his career-high with 3.0 innings in relief, allowing a run and 3 hits...LHP **Jorge De La Rosa**, RHP **Brad Boxberger** and RHP **Archie Bradley** tossed 4.0 scoreless frames combined..

- ♦ FOX Sports Arizona's ratings are up 28% over the average for the first 4 games of last season, including 68% among adults 25-54 years old and 90% in adults 18-49.
- ♦ The average for unique streamers on the FOX Sports GO app is up 29% over last year through the same number of games.

## #WOKE

- ♦ Last night's game time of 5:45 was the longest in terms of time in Chase Field history, surpassing the previous mark of 5:32 (2x; June 24, 2015 vs. CLE; April 3, 2013 vs. STL).

- ♦ The D-backs threw 280 pitches last night, the second most in team history (317 on Aug. 24, 2013 @ Phillies).

## THINGS YOU THINK OF AT 1:00 A.M.

- ♦ Arizona is now 14-3 all-time in games of at least 15.0 innings (courtesy of Pat O'Connell).
- ♦ Prior to last night, the previous longest game in Chase Field history on April 3, 2013 vs. Cardinals, the D-backs earned the win with a walk-off single by Cliff Pennington off Fernando Salas, last night's winning pitcher (courtesy of John Prewitt).

## WAKE UP CALL

- ♦ According to ESPN Stats and Information, the Dodgers entered Monday with a 364-0 record when entering the ninth inning with a 3-run lead or better over the last 8 seasons.

## THE REASON FOR THE LATE NIGHT

- ♦ **Chris Owings** belted the game-tying, 3-run home run off Kenley Jansen in the ninth inning last night, the 10th game-tying homer with 2 outs in the ninth in team history and just the second of the 3-run variety (also: Mark Reynolds, June 11, 2008 vs. Mets).
- ♦ Owings is just the fourth player to hit a 3-run (or better) home run vs. Jansen (third D-back), joining Jarrod Saltalamacchia/ARI on Sept. 13, 2015, Daniel Descalso/ARI on July 4, 2017 and Matt Adams/ATL on July 23, 2017.

## EARLY TEST

- ♦ The D-backs open the season with 12 of their first 15 games against opponents that had a record of .500 or better in 2017.

## TOUCHING ALL THE BASES

**WEATHER & SCIENCE DAY:** The D-backs will host Weather & Science Day on April 4 from 10 a.m. – 11:30 a.m. at Chase Field. More than 1,100 elementary and middle school students will be in attendance for a day of weather and science experiments presented by the Arizona Science Center's Sari Custer and 3TV Meteorologist Kim Quintero.

## SLEEP WALKING

- ♦ The D-backs lead the Majors with 26 walks, ahead of the Marlins (25), Cubs (24) and Nationals (24).
- ♦ 26 walks are the most by a team in the first 4 games since the 2010 Phillies (also 26)...since 1998, only the 1999 Giants (27) and 2005 Padres (27) had more walks in the first 4 games.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** ranks second in the Majors with 7 walks (Freddie Freeman/ATL - 8)

## EARLY RISER

- ♦ **Nick Ahmed** is tied for the NL lead with 7 RBI with Bryce Harper/WSH and Brian Goodwin/WSH...he's tied for second in the Majors with behind only Justin Smoak/TOR (8).
- ♦ Ahmed's 7 RBI are tied for the most in team history through 4 games with Jake Lamb in 2015, Chris Young in 2010 and Jose Cruz in 2005.

## AIN'T NO REST FOR THE WICKED

- ♦ Arizona's 26 runs in its first 4 games are tied for second most in club history (also: 2005), behind the 2017 club (27)...most D-backs runs in first 4 and 5 games:

- ♦ The D-backs have scored 9 of their 26 runs in the first inning this season, most in the Majors...the Nationals are second with 8.

- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** is a career .309 / .381 OBP / .570 SLG hitter with 28 home runs and 90 RBI in 112 career games vs. Dodgers.

- ♦ Made his first career Opening Day start on March 29 vs. Rockies, earning the win (2 ER in 5.2 IP, 8 SO).
- ♦ Has gone 3-0 with 2 saves and 4.42 ERA (39 ER in 79.1 IP) in 16 career games (14 starts) vs. Dodgers...was 0-2 with a 5.06 ERA (6 ER in 10.2 IP) in 2 outings vs. Los Angeles in 2017.
- ♦ Since the start of 2017, has gone 10-4 with a 3.15 ERA (38 ER in 108.2 IP) and 105 strikeouts in 18 starts @ Chase Field.
